Message from the President

ast July 3, the Ateneo de Manila University held its Second Ateneo MVP Annual Leadership Forum. Sponsored by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Manuel V. Pangilinan, who is also Chairman of Philippine Long Distance Telephone (PLDT), it invited as speaker Aleksander Kwasniewski, President of Poland, 1995-2005.

President Kwasniewski gave an excellent address, speaking of the challenge of managing Poland's democratic transition and bringing Poland into NATO and the European Union. He stressed the importance of dialogue and reaching out to all, friend or foe, so the nation and community can come together.

The audience was composed of over 1,000 student leaders from different universities in Manila. What struck us was how engaged the student leaders were. The questionand-answer period went on for over an hour and a half and they wanted more. About 200 student leaders were invited to a further discussion after lunch. This went on for over two hours and, again, they wanted to go on.

This illustrates for me the truth of a quote I made in the program for the Leadership Forum: In her book entitled Leadership Can Be Taught, Sharon Daloz Parks asks a student in the leadership course of Ronald Heifetz at Harvard University why he stayed with the course and his reply is, "Leadership is a word that holds a lot of hungers." She goes on then to name five key hungers in what is perceived as a worldwide crisis in leadership. Two of them are ancient. In each of us there is hunger to exercise some sense of "personal agency-to build something, to make a positive difference" in our world. We hunger for "authority that will provide us orientation and reassurance, particularly in times of stress and fear."

There are new hungers today. We hunger for a leadership that can deal with the "intensification of systemic complexity" emerging in our more connected and interdependent world." We search for a leadership that (Please go to page 2)

teneo de Manila University (ADMU) in Manila, Philippines, has been selected as the Asia-Pacific campus for the Dual-Campus Master's Program in International Peace Studies, an initiative of the United Nations-mandated University for Peace (UPEACE) and the Nippon Foundation, launched on April 10, 2007.The 19-month intensive academic program is designed to enable students from diverse cultures and backgrounds to attain a deep understanding of the central issues of peace and security which will determine the future of humanity. It invests in people working for peace in the Asia-Pacific region, especially the countries where English is not widely used. A memorandum of understanding was entered into between ADMU and UPEACE on October 17, 2006.

Chung Chi (HK) celebrates bicentennial of Rev. Morrison's arrival in China



Chung Chi College of the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) has organized a series of activities from April to July of 2007 to celebrate the bicentennial of the arrival of the Rev. Robert Morrison (1782-1834) in China. The Centre of the Study of Religion and Chinese Society of Chung Chi College has teamed up with eight other Christian churches and academic units in Hong Kong to organize a public lecture, an academic conference and an exhibition of historical pictures. Reverend Morrison of the London Missionary Society first came to China in 1807. He laid a firm foundation for the spread of Christianity in China and for cultural exchange between East and West in the following two centuries.
